DANCING ETIQUETTE AND SAFETY

DANCING IN THE SET

1. Top couple in each set, when asked, count the couples forming the set to dance.

- 2, Pay attention quietly to the teacher explaining the dance and the briefing.
- 3. When a dancer is unsure where to go guide "Gently" no grabbing, pulling, or turning roughly
- 4. Give non-verbal cues to each other, a look, a nod, a wave or a smile to direct a dancer

5. "IF" verbal guidance is needed, only one voice in the set can be used, not many voices. It can be very frustrating and confusing for dancers at all dancing levels.

6. It's fun and quite fine to add dance flourishes if you check with your partner and the rest of the set.

7. Don't **"pressure"** someone sitting out just to find an extra couple to make up a set. Dancers sit out for various reasons ie: physical restrictions, uneasy about executing a dance etc.

ENCOURAGE!.... Don't pressure
